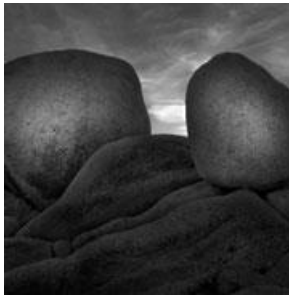
"Wild Graces" Photo Exhibit
